**RESOLUTION NO. 2008-43**

**RESIDENTIAL ANTI-DISPLACEMENT AND RELOCATION  
ASSISTANCE PLAN UNDER SECTION 104(d) OF THE HOUSING  
AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACT OF 1974, AS AMENDED**

The Lincoln Parish Police Jury will replace all occupied and vacant occupiable low/moderate income dwelling units demolished or converted to a use other than as low/moderate income housing as a direct result of activities assisted with funds provided under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, as described in 24 CFR 570.606(b)(1). The Police Jury's Anti-displacement officer is Dennis Woodward who can be reached at (318) 513-6200.

All replacement housing will be provided within three years of the commencement of the demolition or rehabilitation relating to conversion, before obligating or expending funds that will directly result in such demolition or conversion, the Police Jury will notify the public and submit to the Division of Administration the following in writing:

1. A description of the proposed assisted activity;
2. The general location on a map and approximate number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be demolished or converted to a use other than low/moderate income dwelling units as a direct result of the assisted activity;
3. A time schedule for the commencement and completion of the demolition or conversion;
4. The general location on a map and approximate number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be provided as replacement dwelling units;
5. The source of funding and a time schedule for the provision of replacement dwelling units; and,
6. The basis for concluding that each replacement dwelling unit will remain in a low/moderate income dwelling unit for at least 10 years from the date of initial occupancy.

The Police Jury will provide relocation assistance, as described in 570.606 (b) (2), to each low/moderate income household displaced by the demolition of housing or by the conversion of a low/moderate income dwelling to another use as a direct result of assisted activities.

Consistent with the goals and objectives of activities assisted under the Act, the Police Jury will take the following steps to minimize the displacement of persons from their homes;

1. All public facilities projects (water, sewer, gas, etc.) will be designed so that there will be no displacement of any residences or businesses;
2. No homes will be demolished that can be rehabilitated; and,
3. There will be no displacement of any residential or business occupants on LCDBG projects.

Under public comments, Jerry Dingler was present to express concern about people being taken advantage of over the Haynesville Shale and to ask the Police Jury to write a letter to Governor Jindal and the Office of Conservation to not allow oil companies to drill into the Shale unless the land has been leased for that purpose.

Eileen Moore was present to speak about the North Louisiana Exhibition Center Building and to give statistics on recent events at the expo. She noted one problem due to lack of stalls.

Mayors Martha Andrus, Willie Hendricks, Dan Hollingsworth, and Margaret Rogers were present to speak about the election for rededication of funds from the Solid Waste Disposal Fund Reserve.

There being no other business to come before the Police Jury, the meeting was adjourned.
